## Boys & Girls Clubs of Miami-Dade Expand Their Teen Programs

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Miami-Dade recently expanded the availability of its teen programs to four more clubs: Hank Kline, Kendall, Northwest and South Beach.

During the school year, teens participate in the clubs' usual after-school curricula like homework assistance, but they also learn about subjects such as financial literacy, job shadowing, career preparedness and enrichment. There are also programs featuring college tours, ACT/SAT preparation, summer employment opportunities, apprenticeships with the Miami Symphony Orchestra, fitness activities, community service projects, guest speakers and mentorships.



"We are very pleased to now offer our teen program with extended hours within each of the clubs," says Alex Rodriguez-Roig, president of Boys & Girls Clubs of Miami-Dade. "We place great emphasis on helping to prepare teens for college and careers, as well as providing positive, enjoyable programs for them."
