During The Villagers Holiday House Tour, participants were treated to an insider's look at five Coral Gables homes built in the 1920s, including three from Merrick's famous themed Villages.

Conducted Dec. 10, after a pandemic-related hiatus, the return of the House Tour marked the 37th year The Villagers have offered the popular event.

The group also brought back their holiday tradition of raffling off a hand-crafted historic-inspired quilt. Pamela Thomas was the winner of this year's one-of-a-kind piece, *Birds of a Feather*, made in honor of

the historic Doc Thomas House owned by the Tropical Audubon Society.

Co-chairs, Marlin Ebbert and Sweet Pea Ellman put together the day-long event which is a major fundraiser for the organization. Villager members were on-hand throughout the day providing information about the history and unique features of each home.

Proceeds support the preservation and protection of historic sites in Miami-Dade County. Through educating, advocating, fundraising, restoration, and documentation, The Villagers work to preserve the cultural and architectural heritage of local historic sites and neighborhoods. Since 1966, The Villagers have selected more than 75 local organizations as grant recipients and awarded university scholarships to advance historic preservation.

Past keynote speakers include Martin Luther King III, Olympic Gold Medalist Cullen Jones and Stanford University Professor and Martin Luther King Jr. Research and Education Institute director Dr. Clayborne Carson.

During the breakfast and luncheon, the YMCA of South Florida will present two awards in each county. The Dave W. Cash Youth Leadership Award is presented annually to a student in Broward and in Miami-Dade County that has embodied the ideals of Dr. King in advocating for social change in the community. Both recipients are awarded a \$2,000 college scholarship supporting their continued education

The Spirit of Community Award recognizes a community advocate in both Broward and Miami-Dade County who exemplifies the social activism, advocacy, nonviolence, civic engagement and diversity ideals of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Among the past winners are the Children's Trust, Trail Blazers of Broward County, Derek T. Davis, Valencia Gunder, The Mizell Family, Honorable Darrin P. Gayles, Dr. Robert B. Hayling, Willie E. Gary, Officer Lerue Sarvis and Jason Taylor.
